Long before magnetic “paper” dolls and interactive walking, talking baby dolls, there was Bess Bruce Cleaveland’s Jointed Toys. Filled with patterns to be copied, enlarged, assembled, and decorated (whether in paper or wood), Cleaveland’s two-volume set offered potentially hours upon hours of make-believe fun for children in the early 20th century. The books provide explicit directions in general for copying and assembling the patterns as well as specific instructions per pattern for coloring and/or making extra copies of a toy part. The jointed toys include duos (e.g., clown and donkey), seesaw duos (e.g., Mary and her Lamb, two jolly pigs), familiar animals (e.g., dog, goat, rooster, tiger, zebra), famous figures like Santa Claus, and characters from legendary Mother Goose nursery rhymes—Wee Willie Winkie, Humpty Dumpty, and Boy Blue are among the most common; Daffy-Down Dilly and Polly, Put the Kettle On may be less familiar.

This work, first published in 1918, is reprinted by Milne Library at the State University of New York College at Geneseo as part of the Genesee Valley Historical Reprints series. The Genesee Valley Historical Collection is Milne Library’s largest and most accessible collection of local history materials. Its geographical scope covers the eight counties surrounding the Genesee River in New York State: Allegany, Genesee, Livingston, Monroe, Ontario, Orleans, Steuben and Wyoming. Directions for Using Patterns

These Jointed Toys may be cut with scissors from heavy construction paper or light card board, or with a jig-saw from thin pieces of wood.

Place carbon paper between the pattern and material to be used in making the toy, and trace each part of the pattern carefully.

Hectographed copies may also be made and each child given one to outline, cut and assemble.

These patterns may be copied, enlarged or reduced by the use of a pantagraph.

In copying the Mother Goose toys, "Tom, the Piper's Son" and "Tommy Tucker," trace the patterns for the pig and the musical instrument from the completed figure.

Join the parts together as shown in the completed figure.

For the paper toys use small round brass paper fasteners to join the parts together. In the absence of fasteners cord may be used by knotting it on each side of the design.

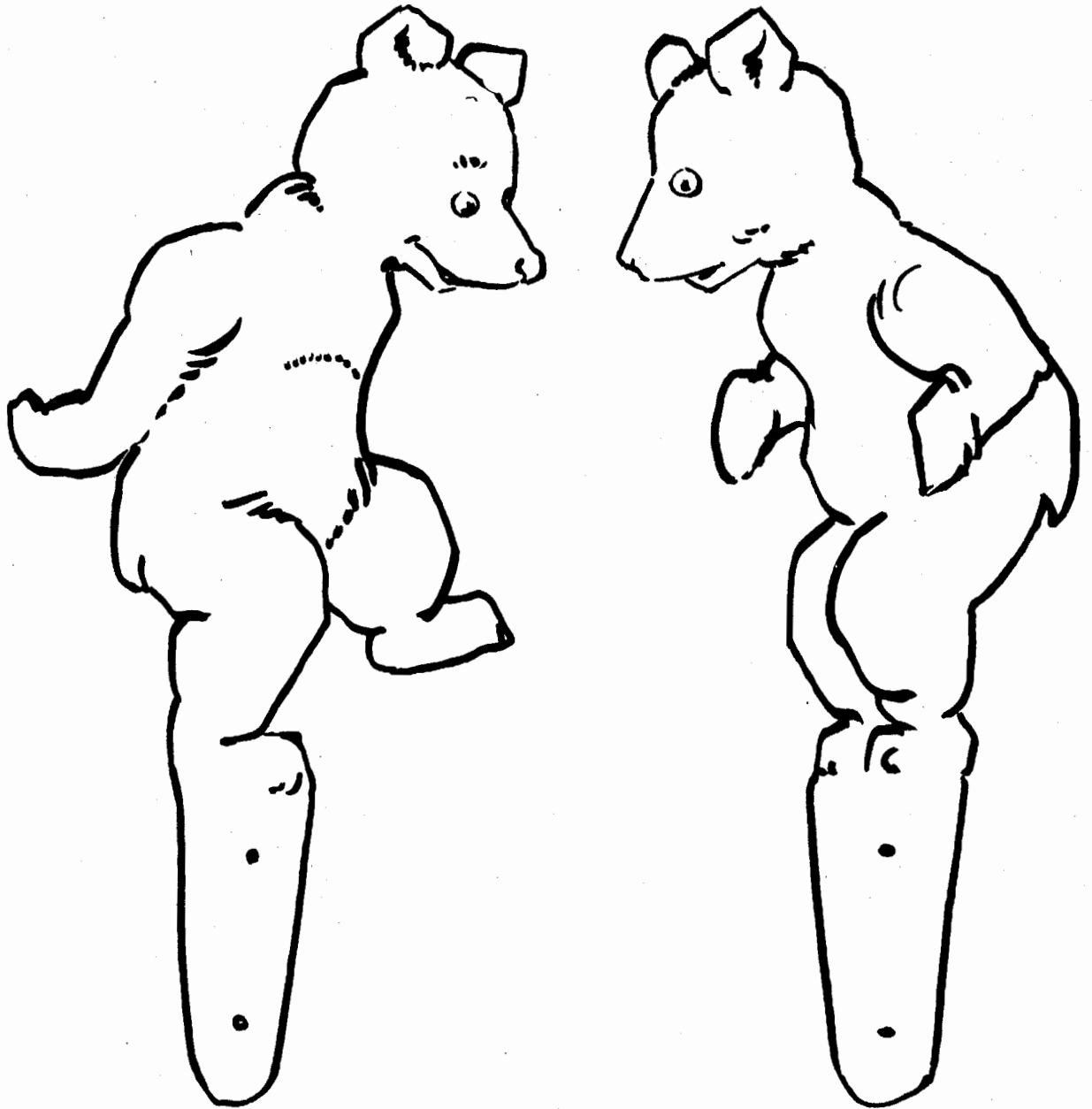
In the wooden toys fasten the parts together with round-headed screws. Do not screw the parts together too tightly.

Coloring directions will be found at the top of each page.

An attractive border for the school or playroom may be made by showing the animals in different poses.

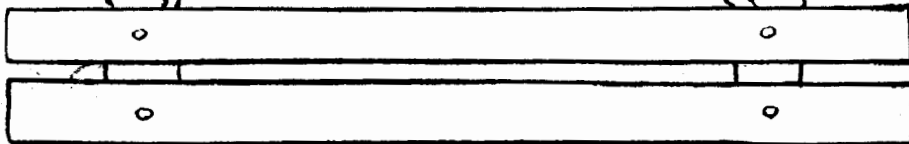
Seesaw Jointed Toy--The Teddy Bears

Color the Teddy Bears light brown.



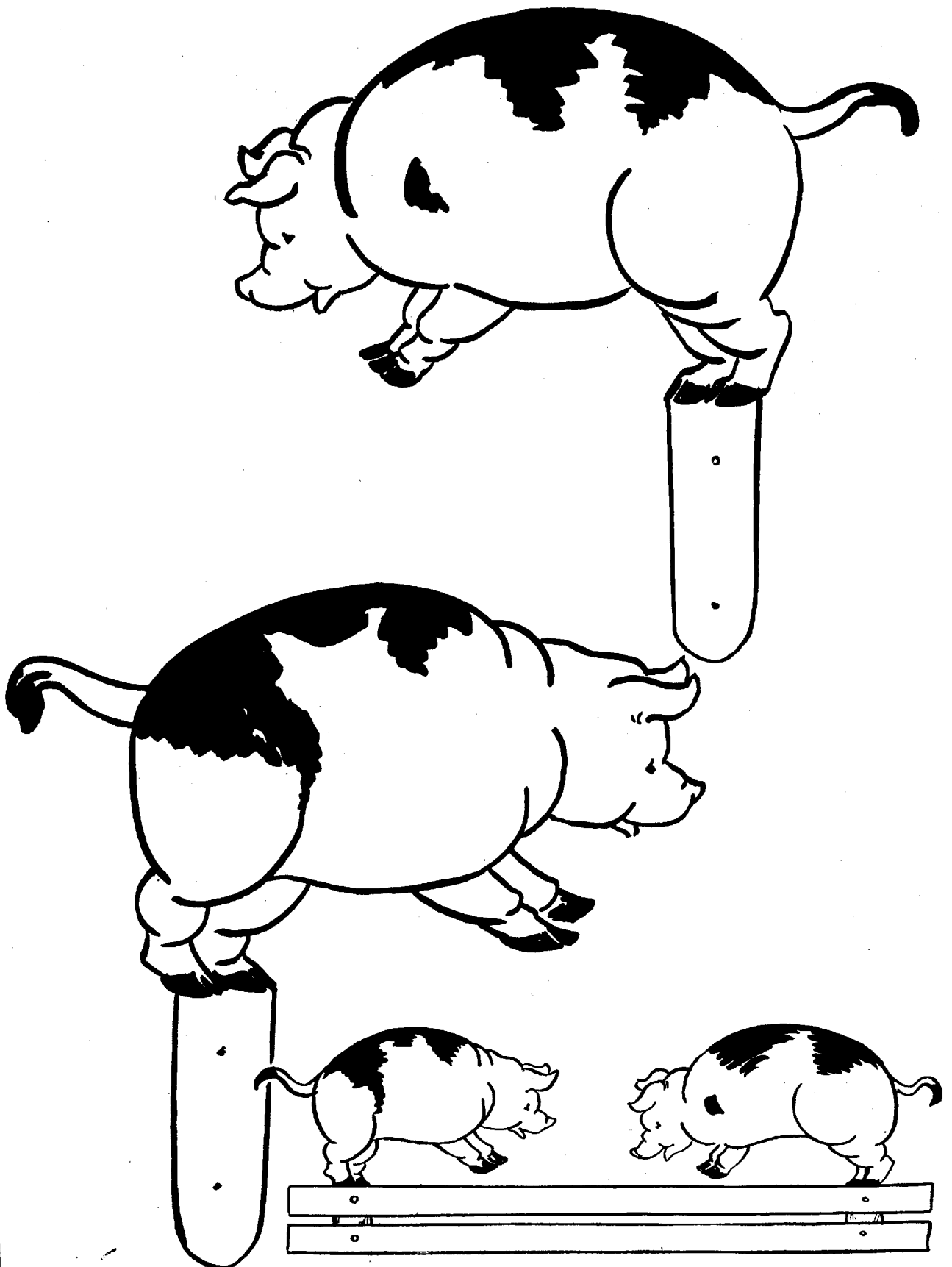
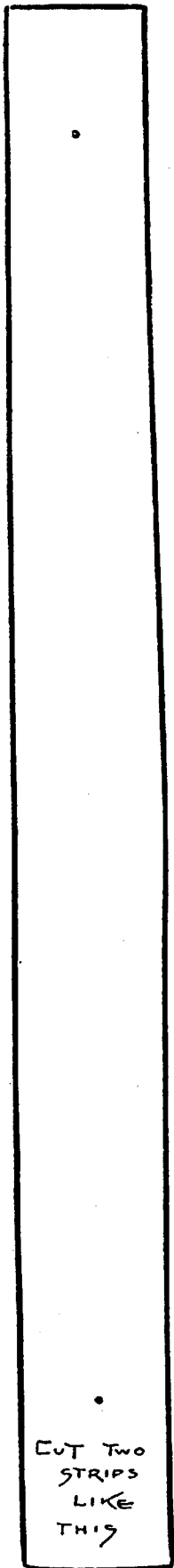

Seesaw Jointed Toy—Two Jolly Pigs

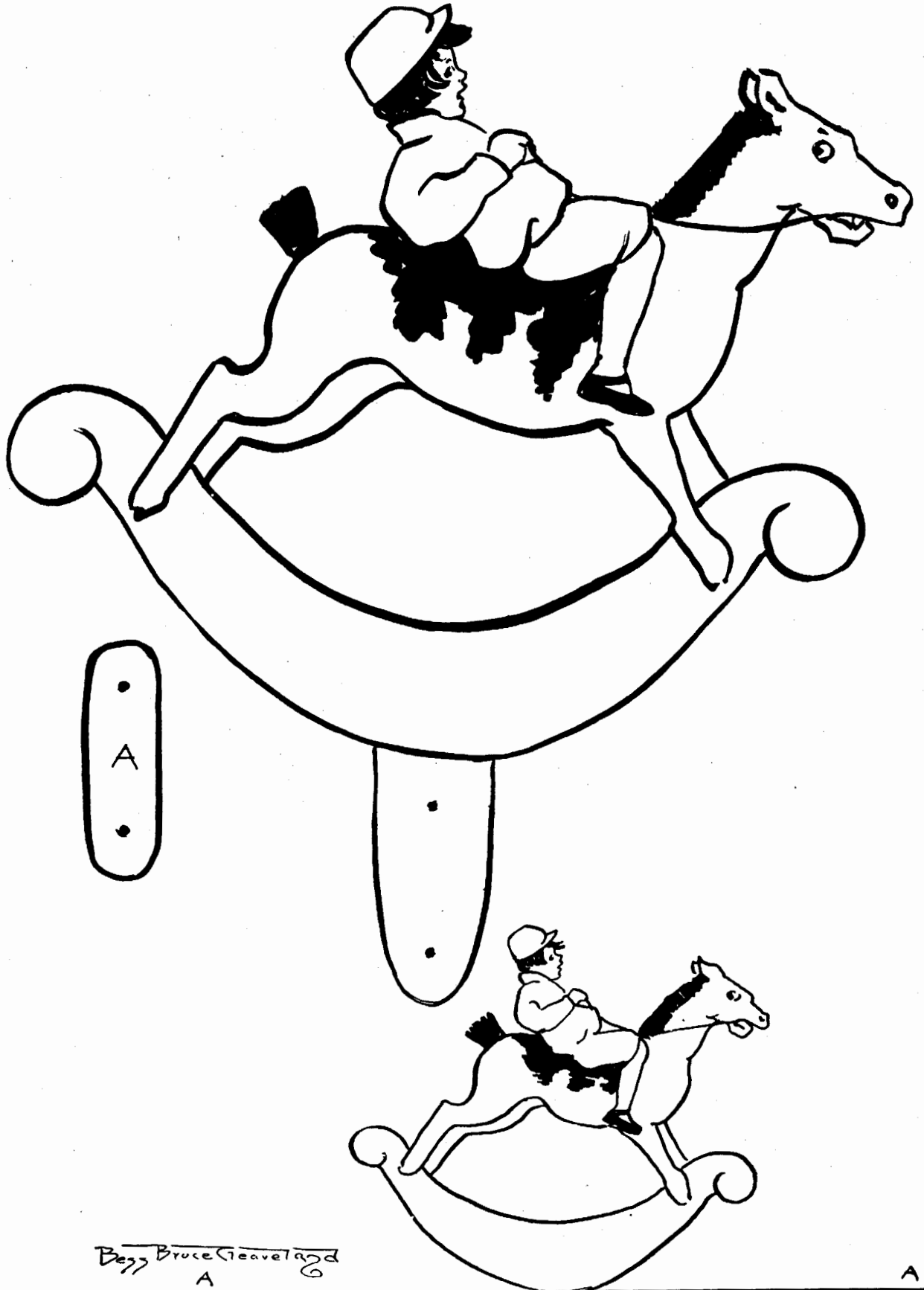
Color the pigs black as in model.

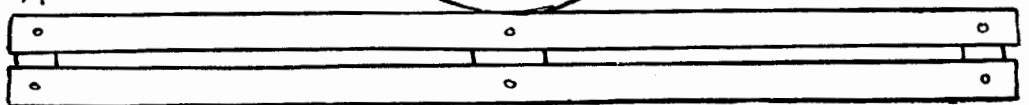

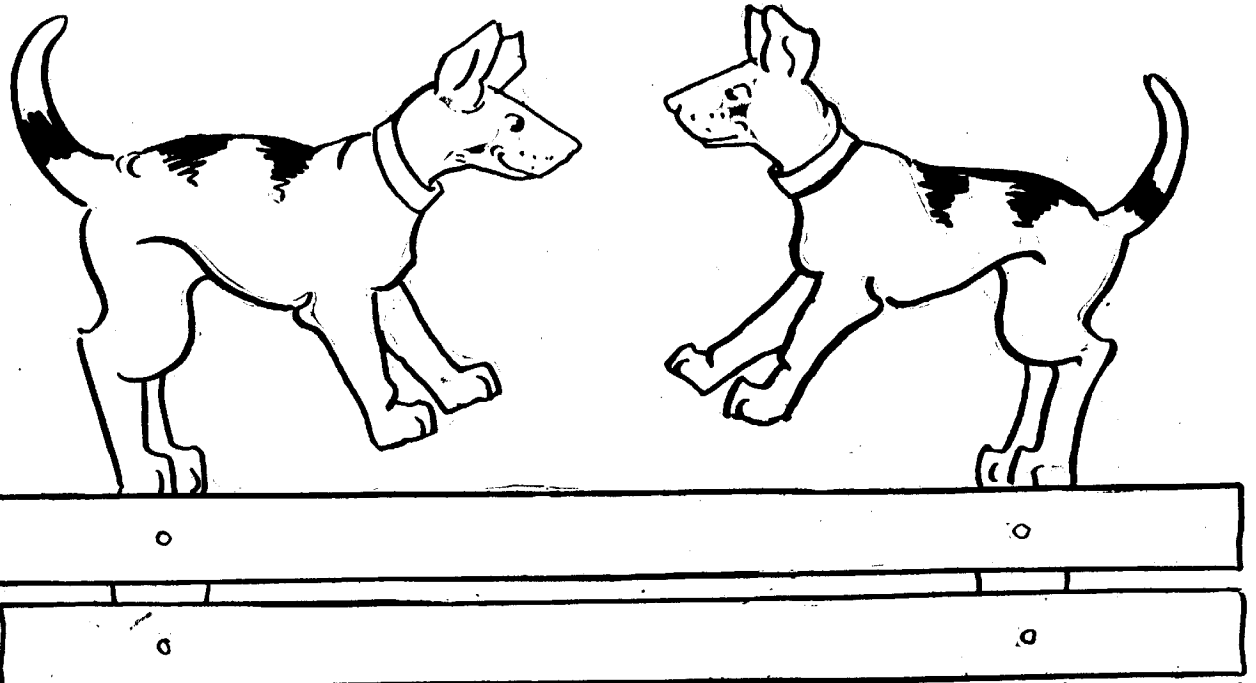
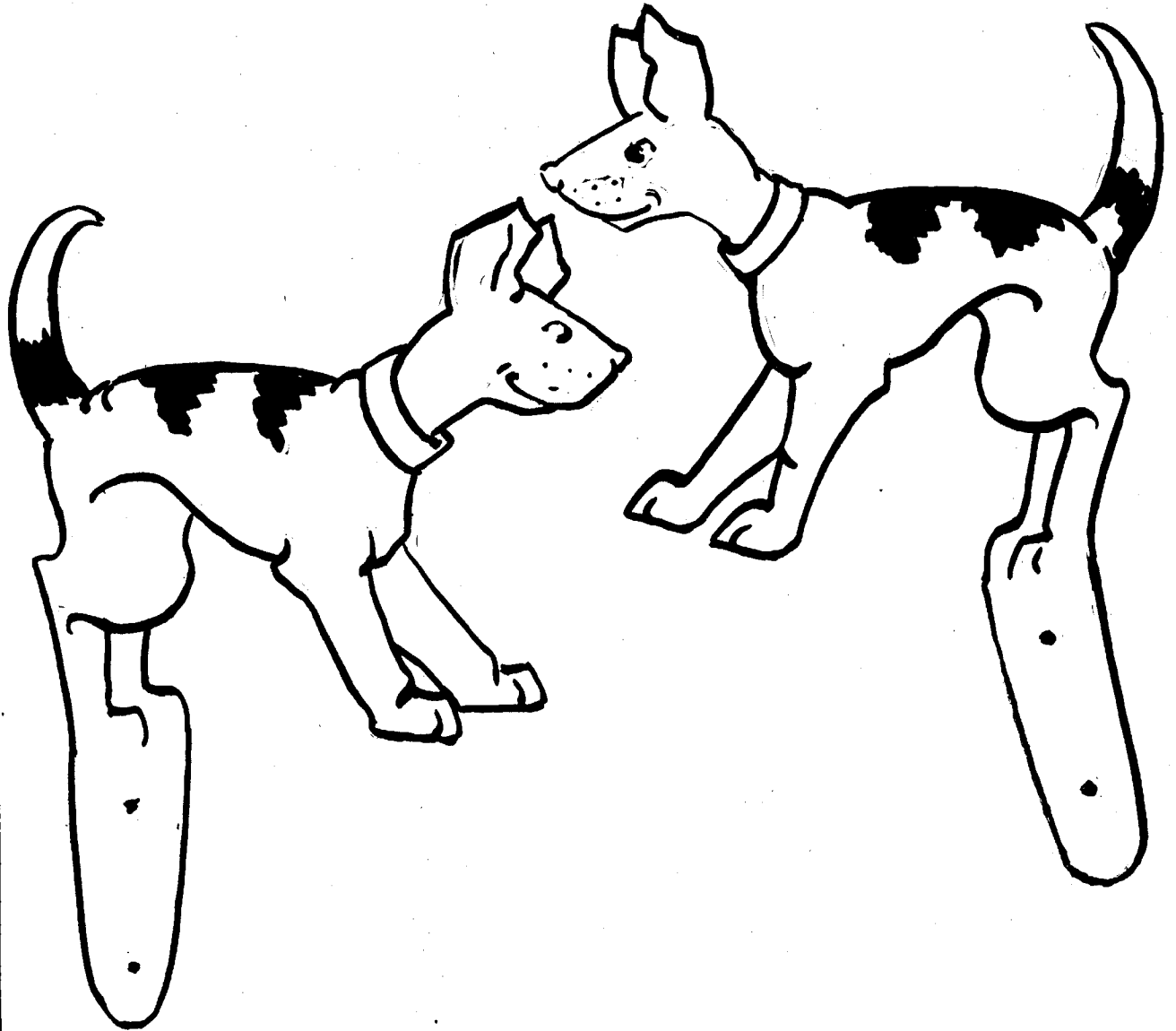

Seesaw Jointed Toy—The Dogs

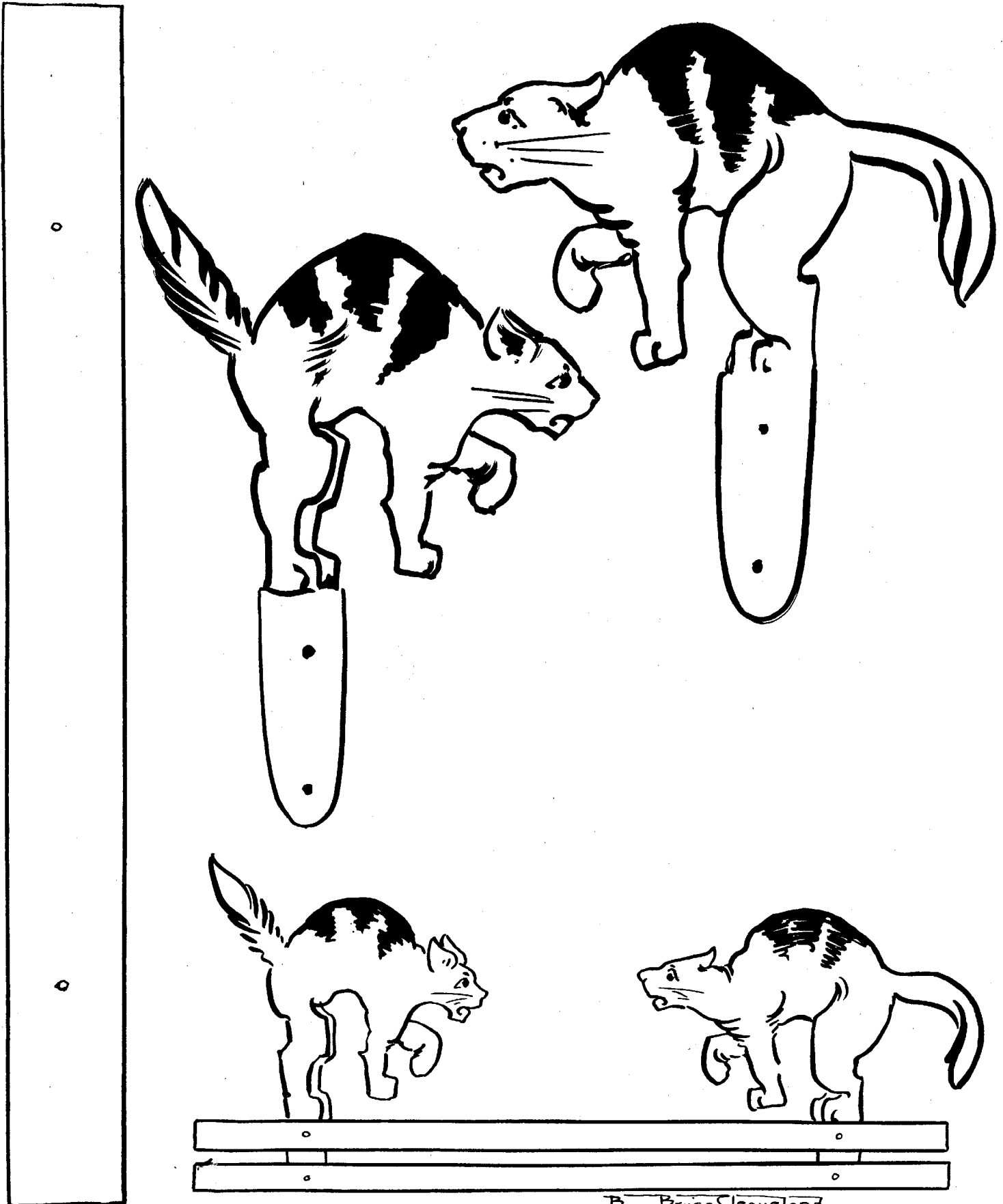
Color dogs brown where black is shown in model.

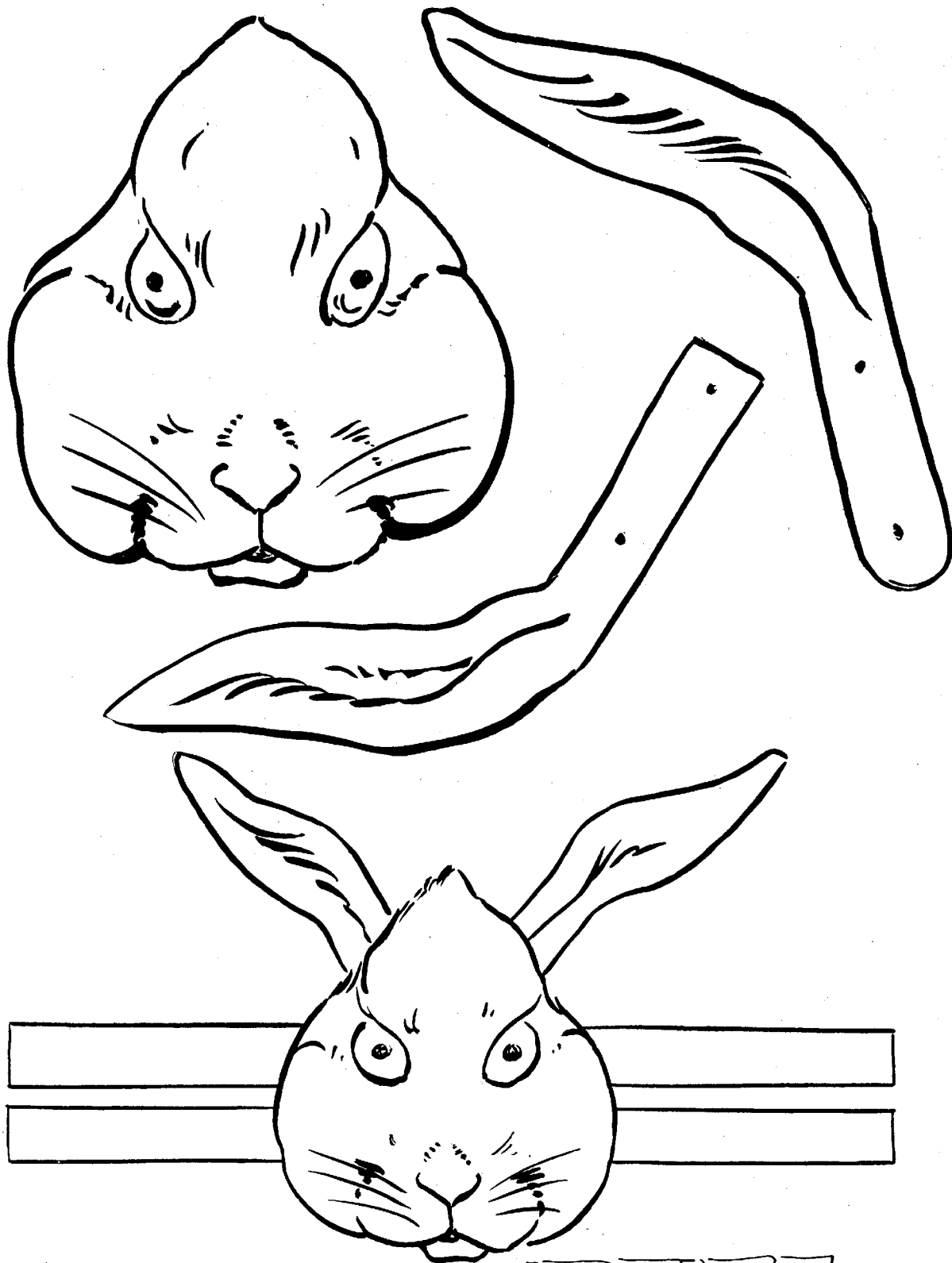
Color cats gray where black is shown in model.

Color the rabbit gray. A touch of pink inside the ears and the eyes will make the rabbit more realistic.

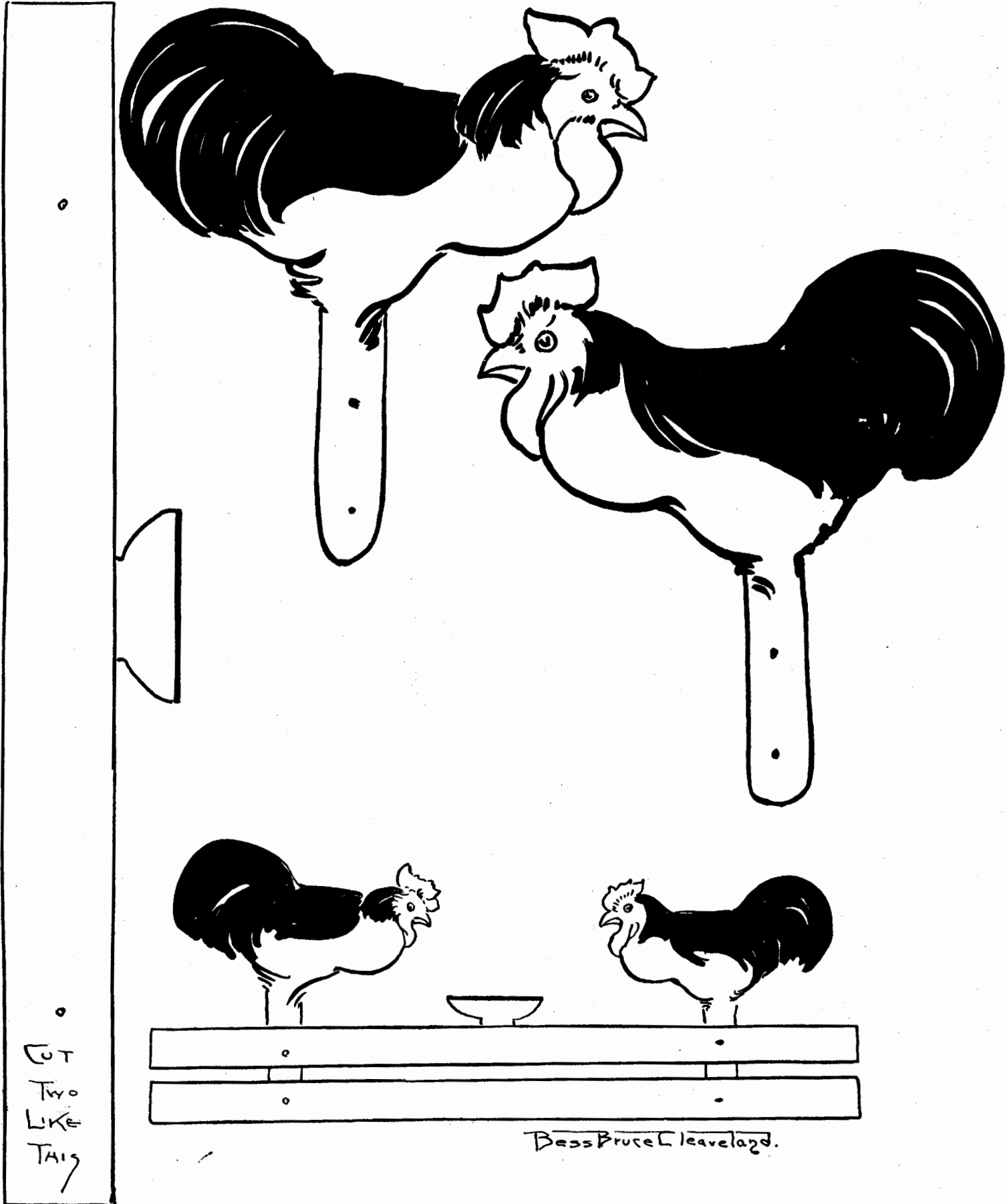

Color the roosters' combs and wattles pink, their bills yellow and back of their eyes.

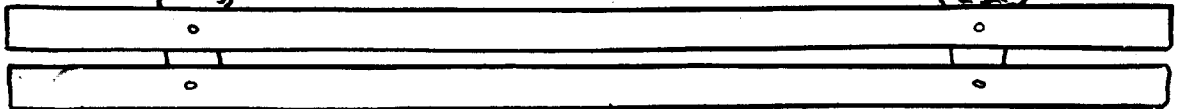
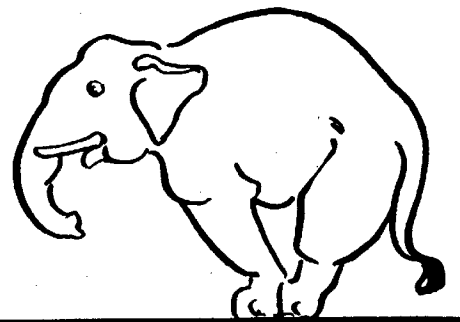
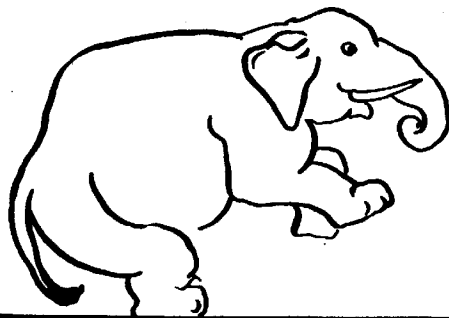
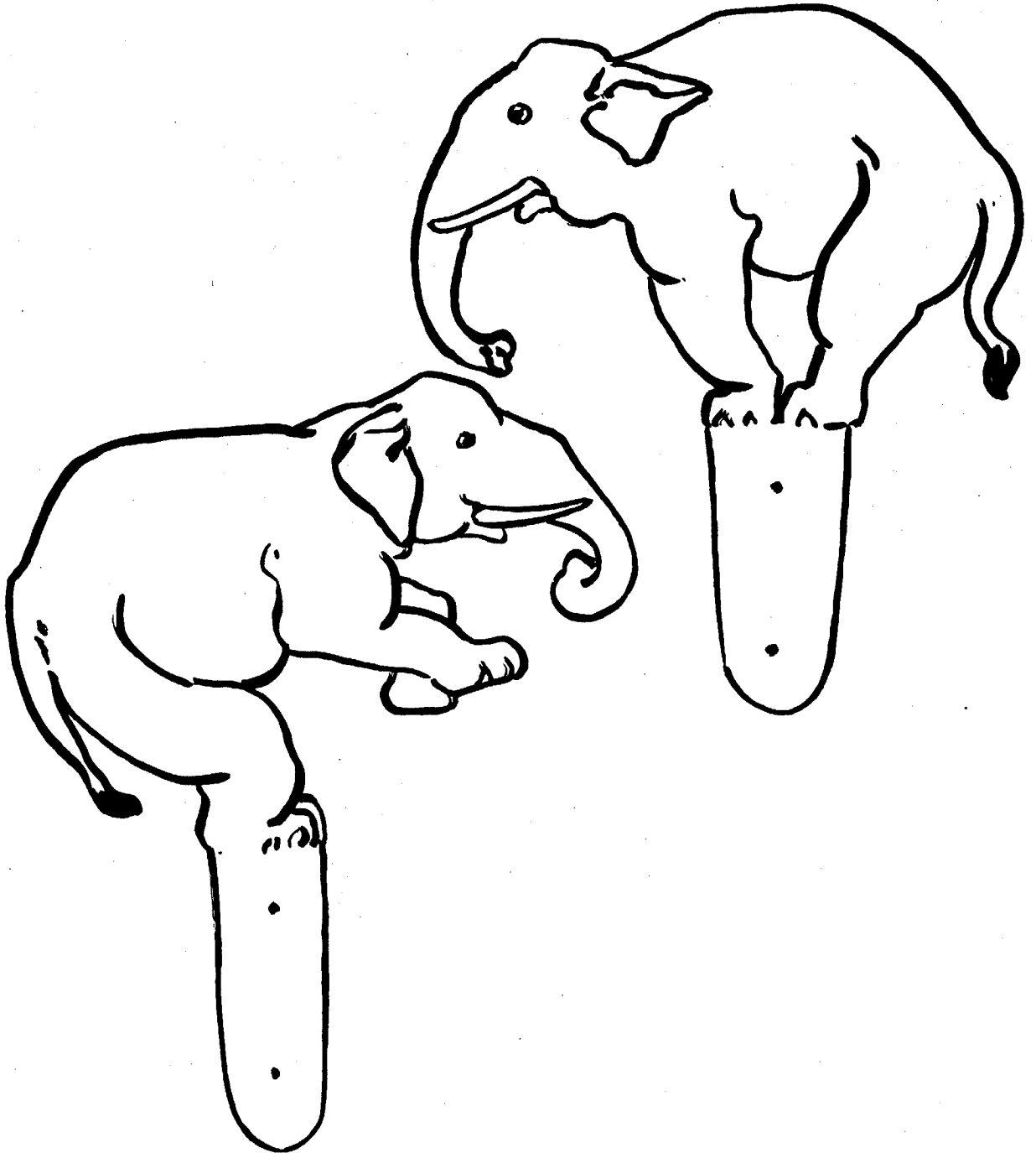

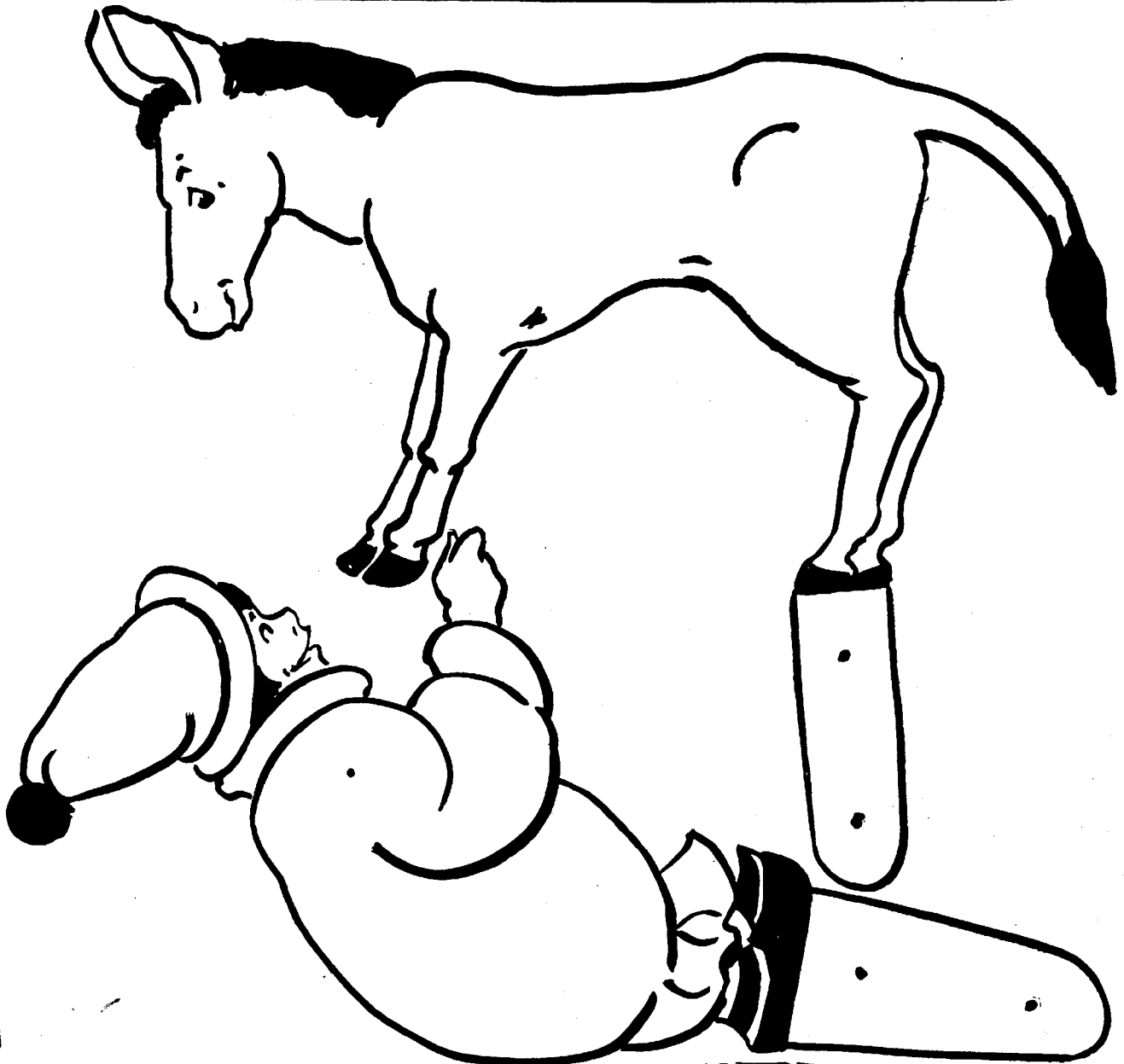
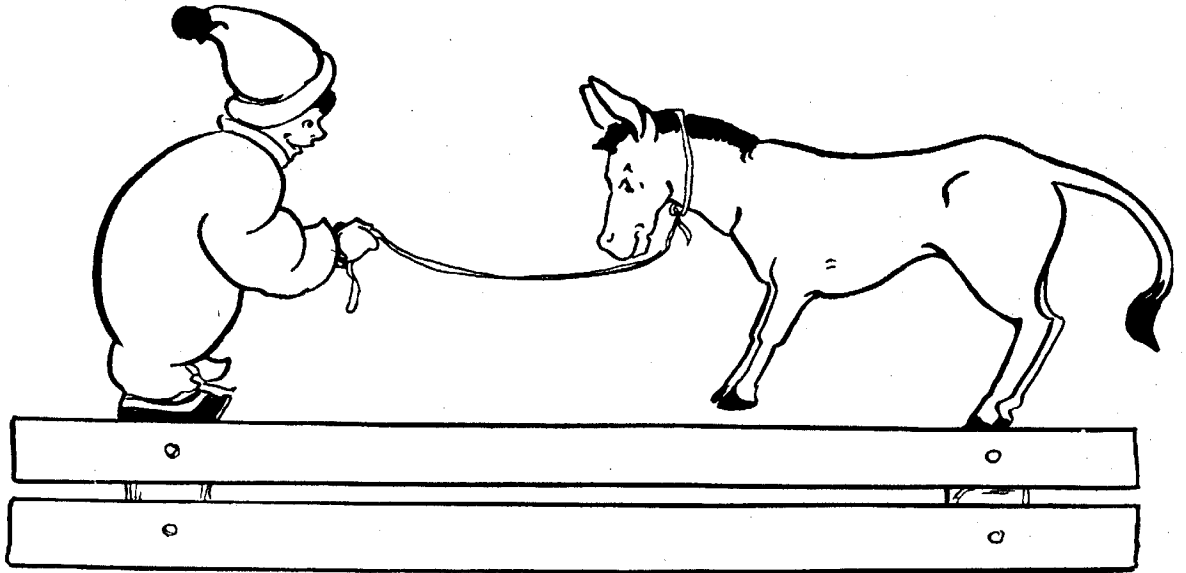
Color the elephants gray.

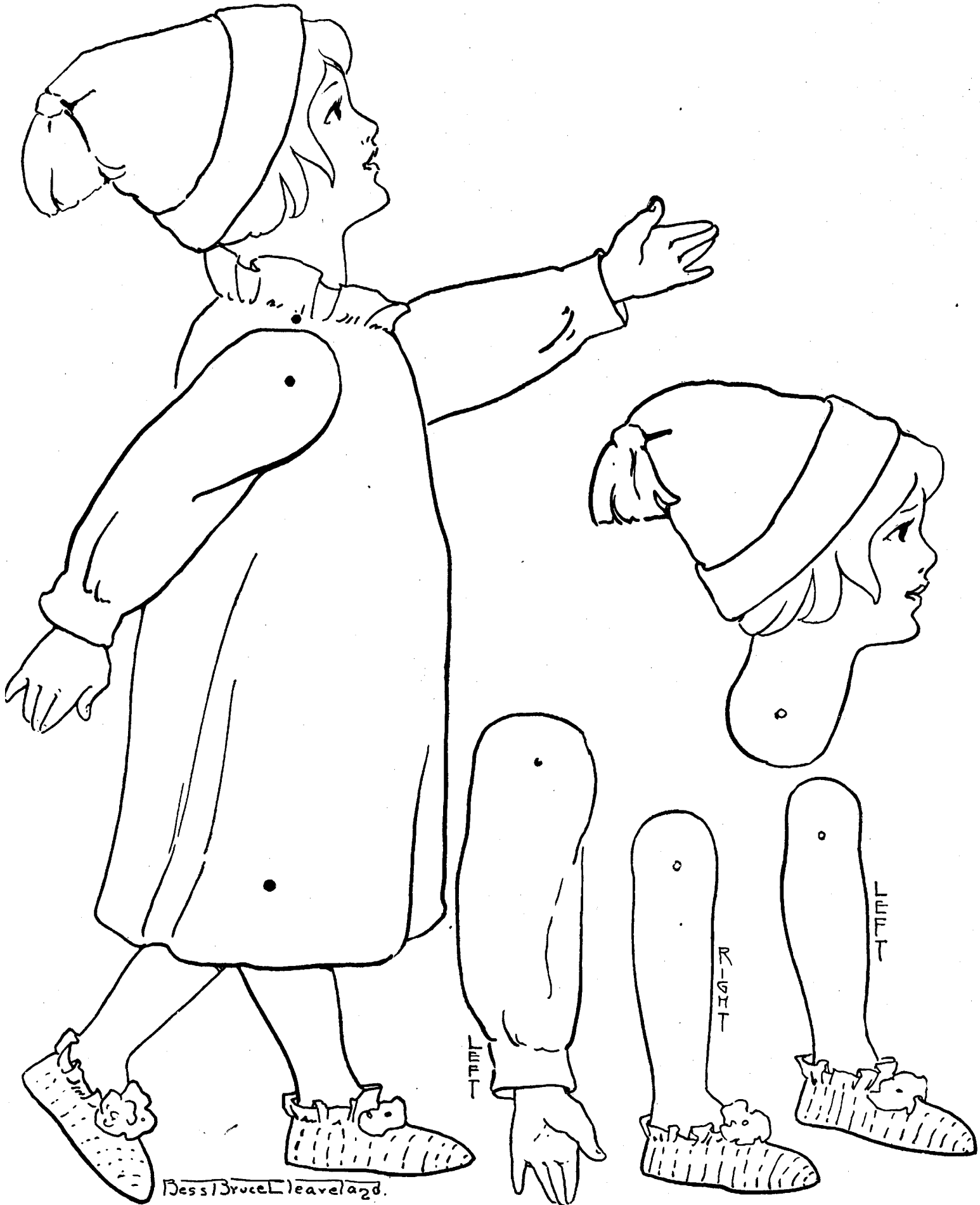
Mother Goose Jointed Toy—Mother Goose and Her Gander

Cut two wings for goose and two sleeves for Mother Goose like those in models. Color the bill and feet of goose orange, Mother Goose's dress and hat band scarlet; hat, overdress and shoes black; ruff, white; hose red and white.



Mother Goose Jointed Toy—Wee Willie Winkie

Color cap and shoes red; hair yellow.



Mother Goose Jointed Toy—Tom the Piper's Son

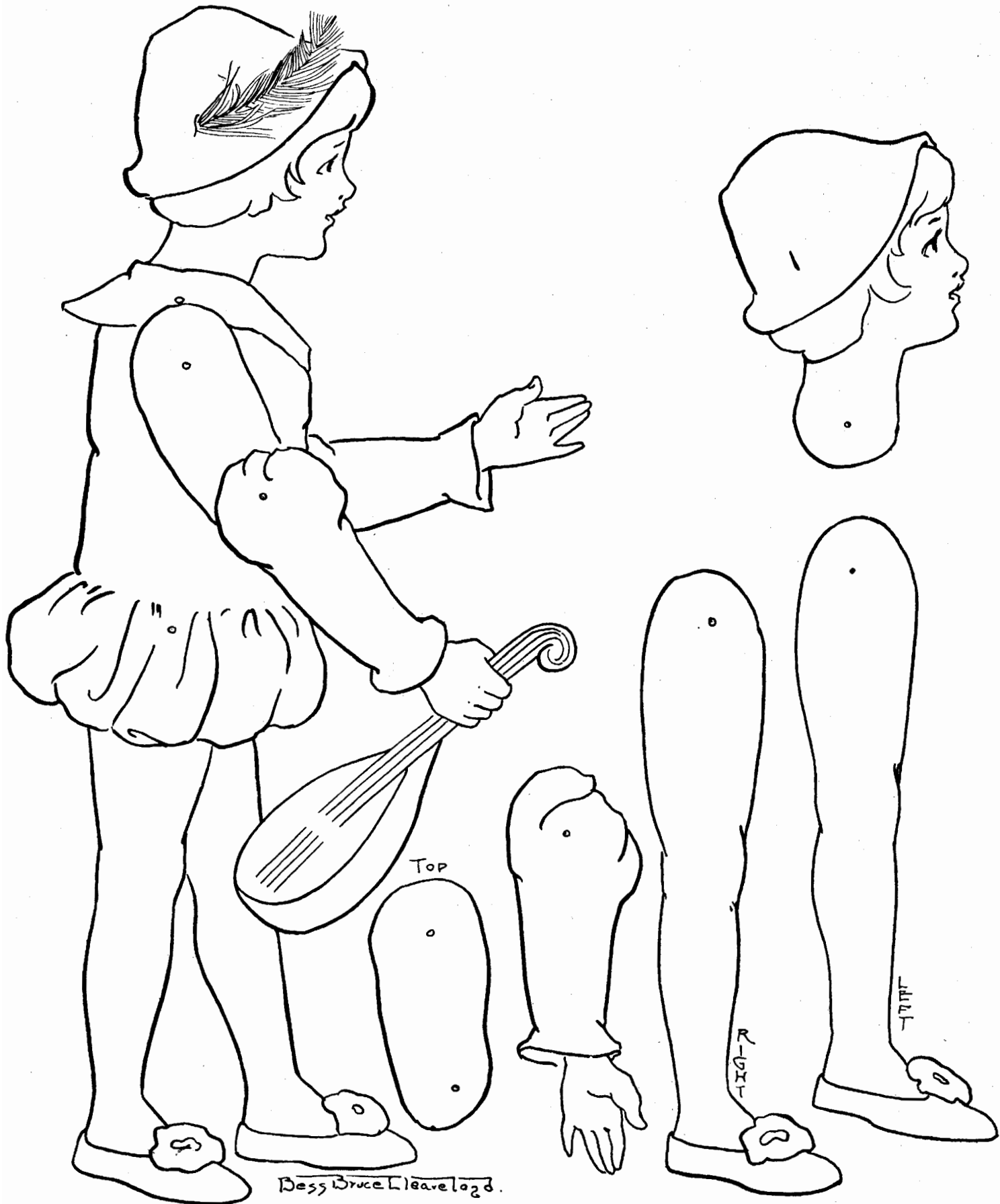
Color Tom's suit green with scarlet trimming and shoes scarlet. His hair is light brown. Color his cap green with scarlet feather.

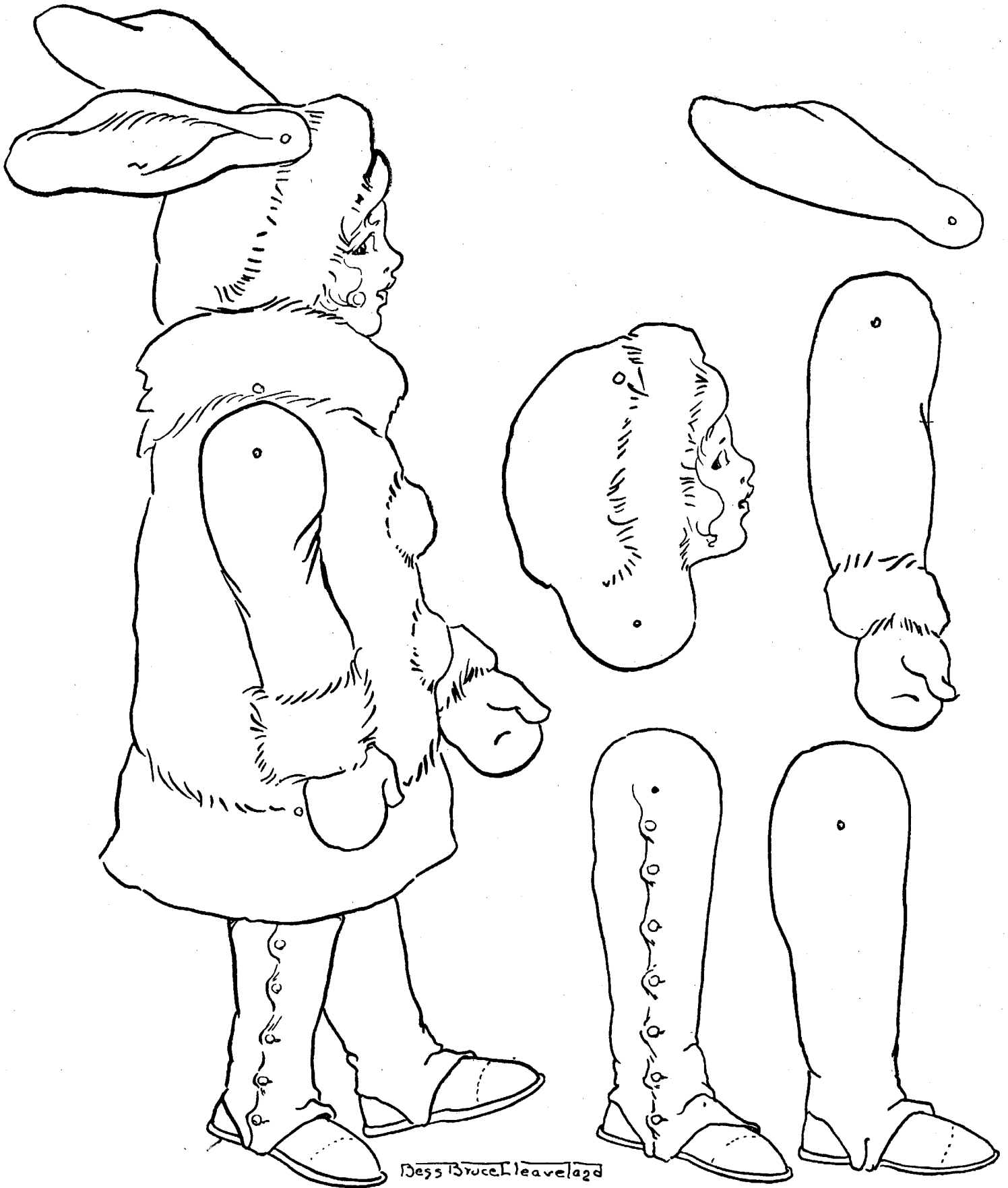
Mother Goose Jointed Toy—Tommy Tucker

Color Tommy's suit green with red collar, hip ruffle and shoes. His hat has a real red feather in slit, held in place by a touch of paste in the back.



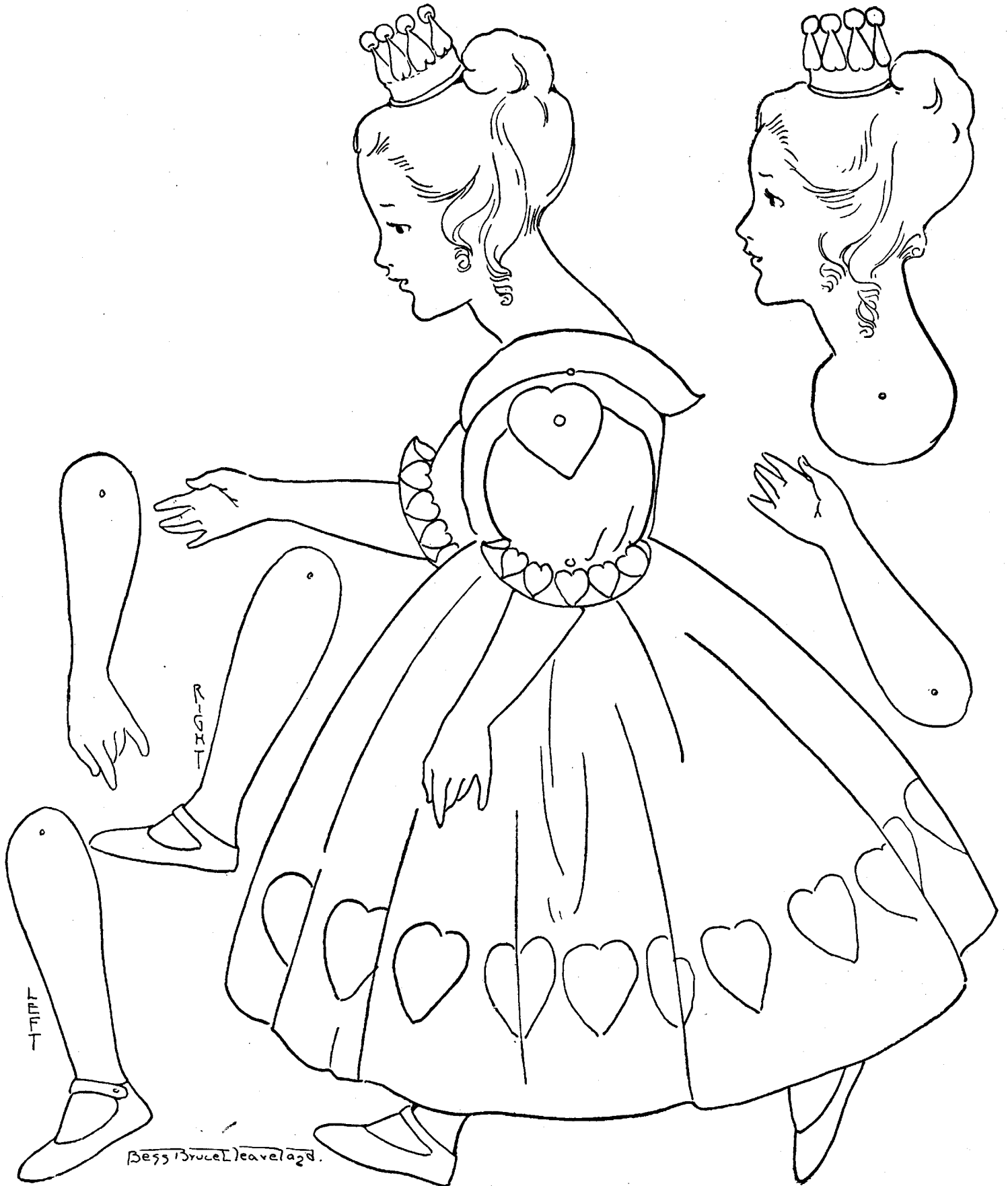
Mother Goose Jointed Toy—Baby Bunting

Color Baby Bunting's hair yellow, mittens and gaiters red. Inside of rabbit's ear should be pink.



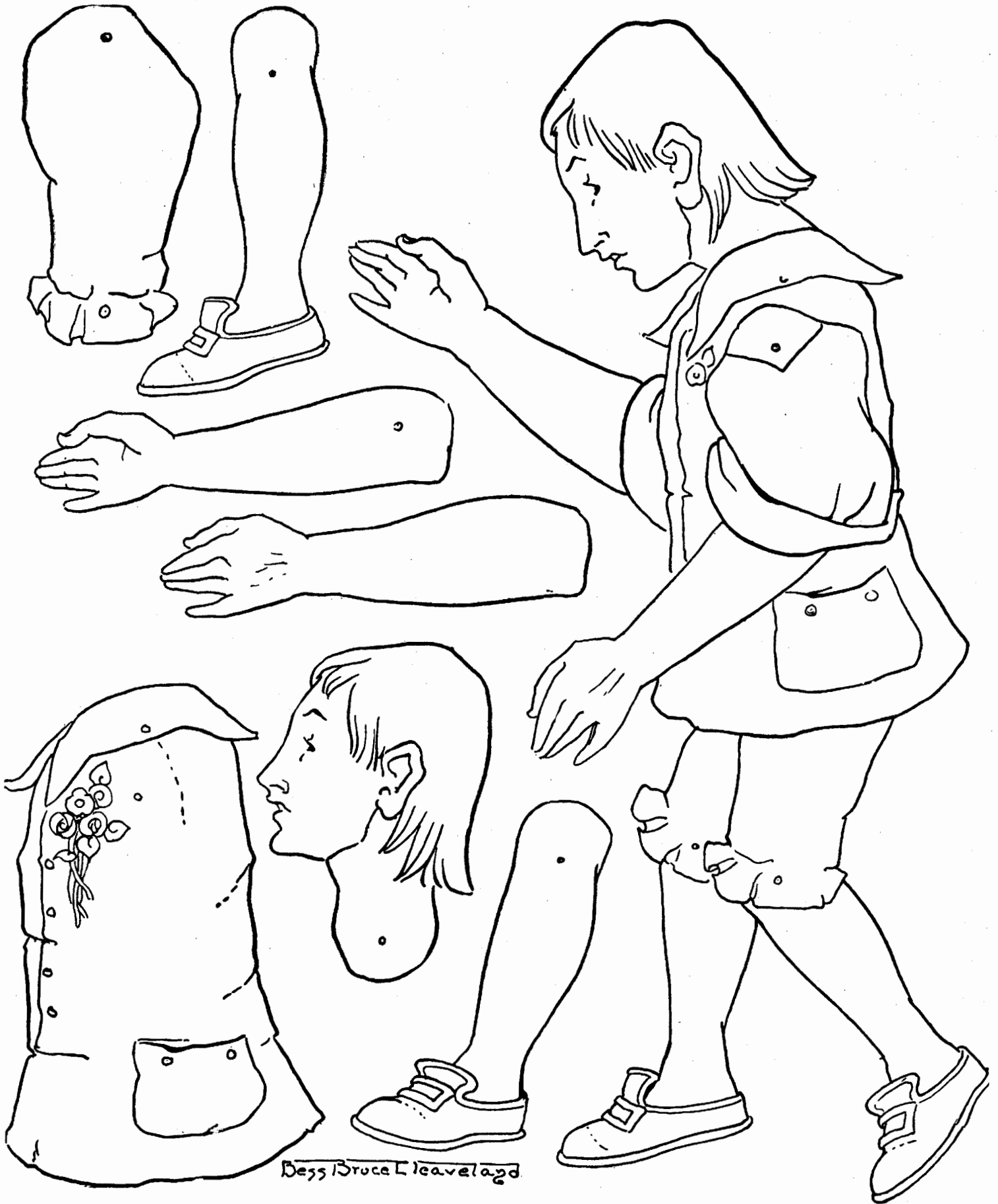
Mother Goose Jointed Toy—The Queen of Hearts

Color hair red-brown, crown gold, dress white with red hearts,
and slippers red.



Mother Goose Jointed Toy—Simple Simon

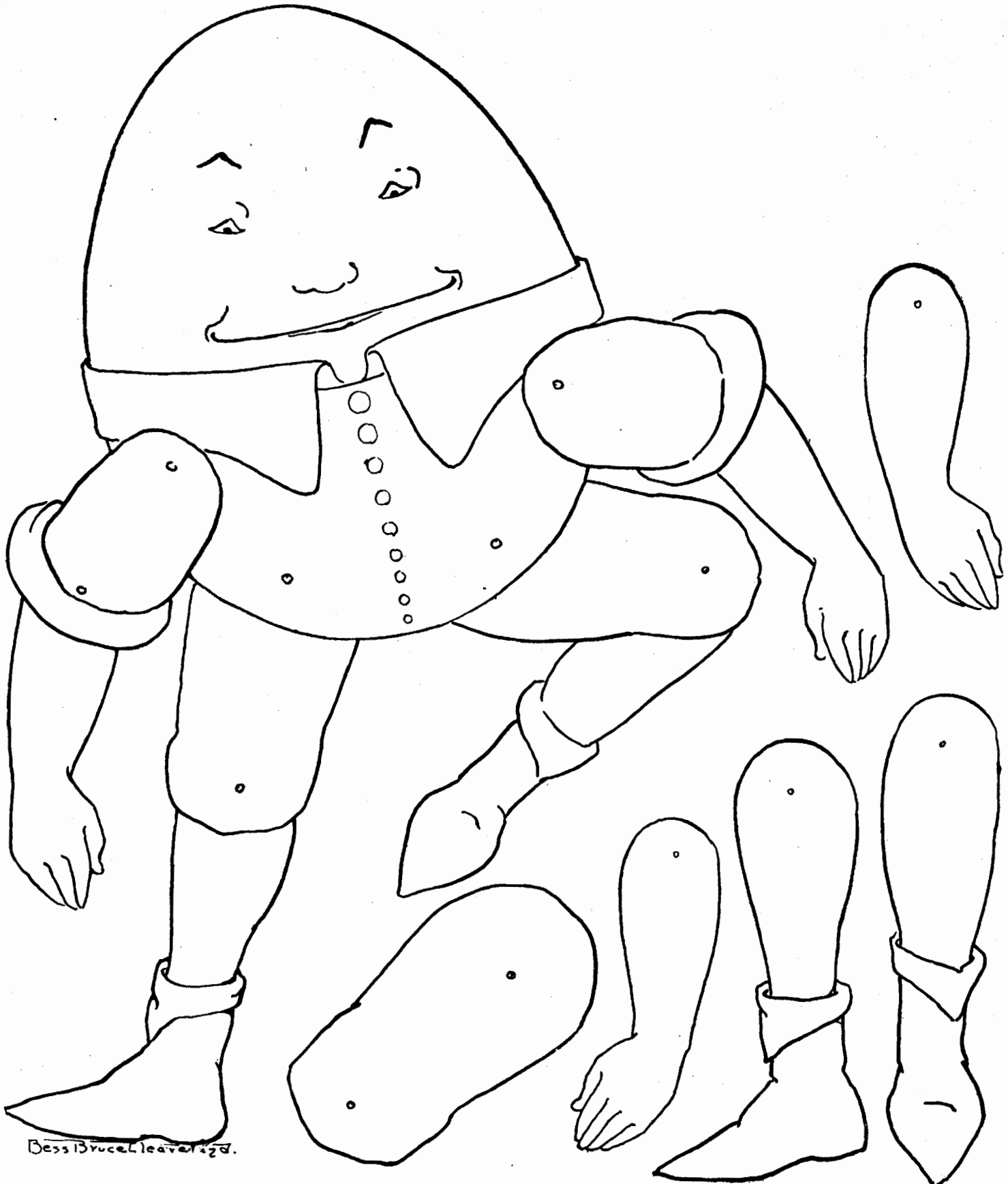
Color Simon's hair pale yellow, suit light green with white collar and cuffs, hose tan, and shoes brown with gold buckles.

Mother Goose Jointed Toy—Humpty Dumpty

Color Humpty's nose, cheeks and lips pink, vest light green with white collar; trousers, stockings, shoes and sleeves blue, with brown cuffs.



Mother Goose Jointed Toy—Daffy-Down-Dilly

Color the costume yellow-orange, except the bodice, and turned-up ruffle around the bottom of the skirt. These should be green. Color the sandals light brown and the petals of the cap yellow-orange with the sepals green.



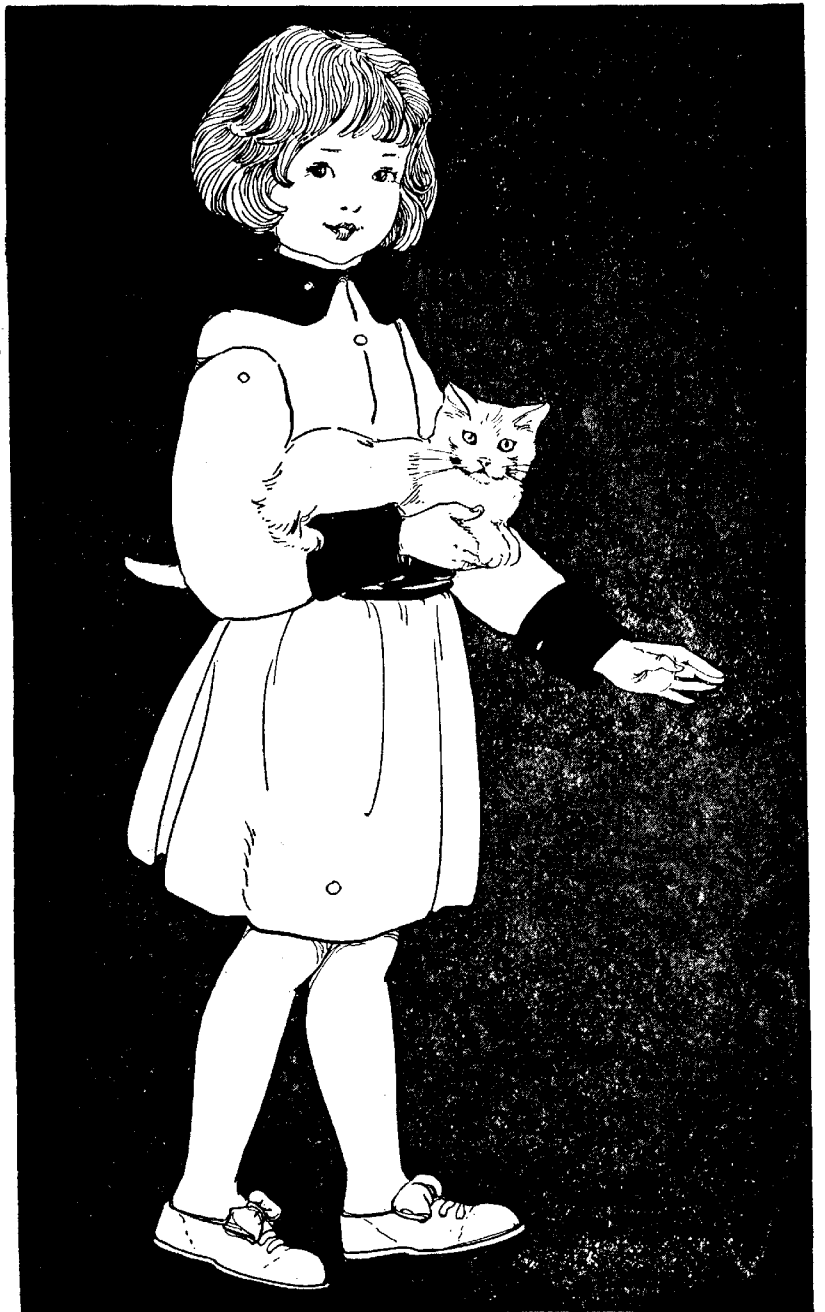
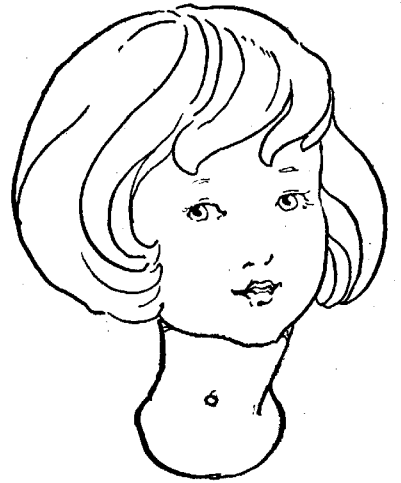
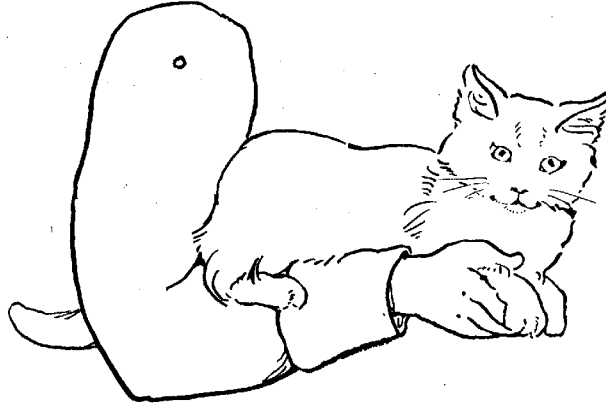
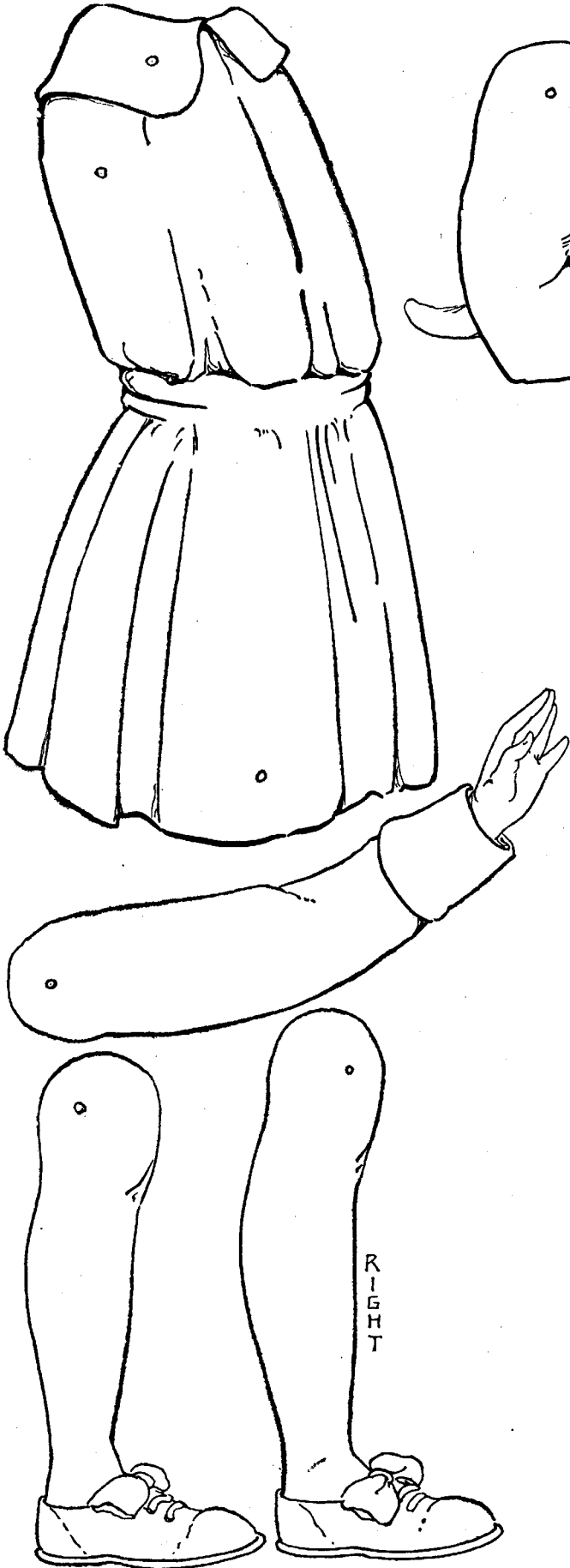
Mother Goose Jointed Toy—Boy Blue

Color Boy Blue's hair yellow, cap blue, suit blue with white collar, horn yellow.



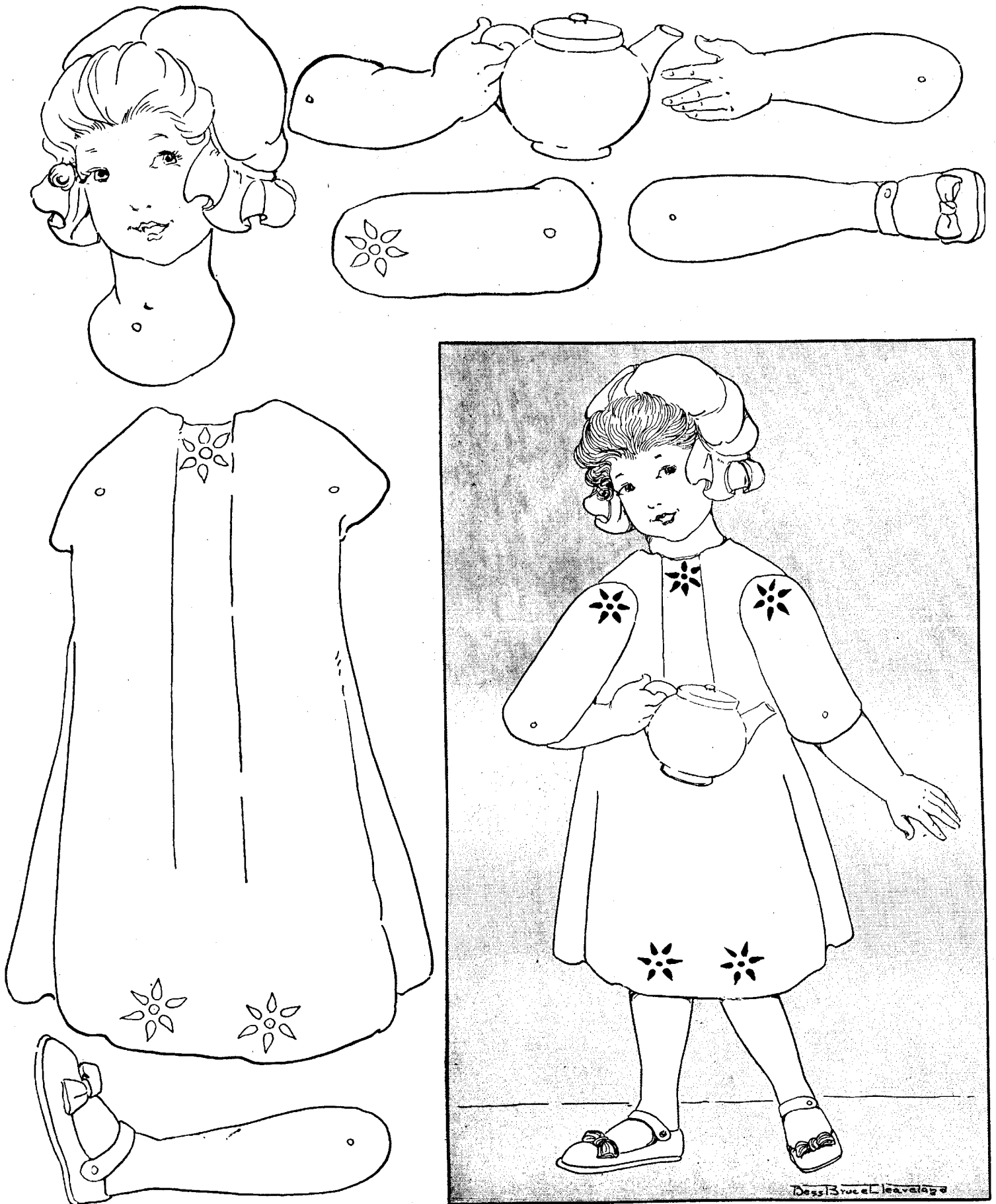
Mother Goose Jointed Toy - "I Love Little Pussy"

Color the girl's hair, collar, cuffs, belt and shoes black. Her dress should be light green. Color the cat gray with yellow eyes.



Mother Goose Jointed Toy—"Polly, Put the Kettle On"

Color the teapot yellow, Polly's dress blue with darker blue embroidery and slippers blue.
The ribbon on her cap should be blue and her hair pale yellow.



Mother Goose Jointed Toy "Sing a Song of Sixpence"

Color the lad's hair and shoes black and his suit red. The pie is light brown in a blue dish.
