



History of the Riot Grrl Movement:

- Underground feminist punk movement originating in Olympia, Washington and Washington, DC in the 1990s
 Originated from Punk Music, with a feminist twist
- Gave feminists a chance to air their frustrations with common issues in women's oppression
- Songs talked about issues such as heteronormativity, goals for the modern women's rights movement, and rape culture
- Often feature semi-aggressive lyrics and topics, hence the term "Riot Grrl" with the growling affect, as opposed to Riot Girl
- Transformed into modern Girl Power in popular culture
