- Library resources shared between our two campuses
- Longtime users of ILLiad
- Resource Sharing Alma Spring 2024

### Purposes and Benefits of Interlibrary Loan

- Obtain items that are not owned within the library collections
- Obtain items currently checked out from the library collections
- Obtain items already owned within the library collections/accessibility
- Obtain items that may be lost/missing from the library collections



  - Zoom research appointments and consultations


 Lack of physical accessibility and limitations brought ILL to the forefront

- Impact of ILL requests on collection development


### Collection Development and Interlibrary Loan

- RSC Library ILL requests considered for purchase with consult from Collection Development librarian
- Collection Development policy -
  - Fulfillment of academic programs and majors at the College
  - PDA Patron Driven Acquisitions may impact circulation usage if directly requested

 Interlibrary Loan spills over into other library departments - another benefit
